Conserve Water

Reduce Chemical Use

- ☐ Raise the mower blade to 3 inches every time you mow; this will decrease your water, fertilizer and pesticide needs.
- ☐ Spot spray herbicide rather than broadcast spraying AND only spray when it is the most effective way to control weeds.


